Format du Test 3

The 3rd test for the semester will be on **Tuesday, Oct. 21**. It will be based on Module 3.

Here is a general idea of what types of **formats** and **content** you might see on it. It would also be a good idea to go over exercises we've done in class (from the book or worksheets). We'll also be practicing in class with exercises similar to what you might find on the test.

Important reminder: Languages are cumulative: you have to remember things you've previously learn and build off of these. You are still expected to know words and structures you learned in Modules 1-2, but the main focus of the test will be on the new material from Module 3.

A) Formats. Some types of questions might include:

- **Discrimination:** Listen and distinguish between forms (masc/fem, sing/pl)
- **Dictée:** Write down the word or number you hear.
- **Réponse courte:** Give a logical answer to the questions given.
- **Remplir les trous:** Fill in the blank with an appropriate word in the correct form.
- **Transformation:** Change the sentences by adding or changing the words indicated
- **Composition:** Write a paragraph about a given topic.

B) Vocabulary. p. 75 (numbers) and p. 90-91 list the vocabulary you need to know for this chapter. Some of the main vocabulary types include:

- **numbers** (review also 0-60 from Module 1 if needed)
- **family**
- **bedroom and personal belongings**
- **adjectives and verbs**
- **place prepositions** (dans, près de, etc.)

C) Grammar. p. 84-89 show you the grammar you should know. Some important types of grammar to know include:

- the **possessive adjectives**
- the verb **venir**
- the preposition **de**, its forms, and how to use them (possession, relationships with proper names or common nouns, etc.)
- adjective **agreement** and **placement** (BAGS vs. 'normal')
- **place prepositions** (dans, près de, etc.)

D) Culture. You should be able to answer basic information about French-speaking culture. These are typically found on the Perspectives culturelles pages (unless otherwise noted).

- p. 67-8 & handout. **Family life** in French-speaking countries, e.g. France, Sénégal, Québec (marriages, civil unions, traditional family)
- p. 77-80. **Living situations** for French university students: living at home, funding for housing, vocab for renting, etc.
- p. 82-83. **La famille Bellelli:** the painting, its painter, and related information
