Imaginez que vous avez gagné au loto! Vous décidez de voyager à un pays ou une région francophone. Suivez (follow) les instructions ici.

## **General format**

- 1) Write a **paragraph** of **8-10 sentences** in French.
- 2) Choose <u>one</u> country/region/city/etc. <u>BESIDES FRANCE</u> where <u>French or French créole is a major language spoken</u>.
  - 3) Make sure to include the following
    - · Say where you are going
    - Who is going with you (avec = with, seul(e) = by yourself)
    - How you plan to get there (by plane, boat, train...)
    - What type(s) of transportation you'll use once you're there.
    - At least <u>2 things</u> you want to do or see. These should be tailored to your destination (you can include other info about why you'd like to visit the country also, if you'd like).
  - 4) Be sure the composition **flows logically** (ideas, transitions, etc.)
- 5) The composition should be **HANDWRITTEN** on **notebook paper** (or the back of this sheet).



## Other important info/advice (please read these!)

- 1) The idea is for you to find out more about the French-speaking world and practice with vocab and grammar you know, even if it means your composition will be simpler than what you would write in English.
- If you feel your French is pretty good, feel free to use a variety of vocabulary/structures to express your ideas creatively
- If you feel your French isn't as good, you can still be creative, but you might try to keep your ideas / sentences pretty straightforward to make sure you understand what you're saying.
- 2) **YOU MUST USE AT LEAST ONE SOURCE** & at the end of the composition, <u>CITE</u> THE SPECIFIC SOURCE(S) (NAME, FULL WEB ADDRESS, PAGE, ETC.) OF YOUR INFORMATION. If you use *Motifs*, say what page you got the info on. If you use a website, give a specific URL (address); if you use a paper encyclopedia, give the name, publication date, page, etc.
- 3) **DO NOT COPY WORD-FOR-WORD FROM A SOURCE.** (Copying directly without quotation marks would be considered plagiarism. For this exercise, please don't use direct quotations even with the quotes.)
- 4) YOU <u>CANNOT</u> USE ANY UNAUTHORIZED OUTSIDE HELP such as an online translator (Google or others), a tutor, a friend, etc. If you're not sure whether something is allowed, you should <u>ask me</u> before doing it.
- 5) You <u>CAN</u> use a dictionary (a paper one or <a href="http://wordreference.com">http://wordreference.com</a>, for example), your textbook, or notes/info from class, or ask me a question.
  - 6) As usual, you will be graded on CONTENT, VOCAB, ORGANIZATION, and GRAMMAR.
  - 7) You can use a photo, map, etc. if you'd like to illustrate your composition, but it's NOT required.

Try to do something that would be interesting or fun for you. Bon voyage et bonne chance!
